3.2 Conditional Use C-68-18 – Lots 2-6, Block 9, Plan 928

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Council of the Rural Municipality of Brokenhead opens this Conditional Use Hearing, the time being 7:06 p.m., to hear Conditional Use File No. C-68-18, submitted by applicant River Trail Development Corporation.

Chief Administrative Officer Sue Sutherland summarized the application for Conditional Use C-68-18 by River Trail Development Corporation. Mr. Chris Goertzen was in attendance to introduce the project to Council and describe the features of the housing development design. Council was then given the opportunity to ask questions. The Reeve then asked the audience if anyone would like to speak in favour of the application.

Mrs. Wanda Hartwich is in favour of the project, however had concerns about drainage. Ms. Sutherland explained that an engineered drainage plan will be required, as well as a water rights license. It is illegal to drain the water off one property onto a neighbouring property.

Speaking in opposition of the application was Mr. Kevin Ilchyna. At the Beausejour Brokenhead Development Corporation public forum held in April in Garson, it was established that 55+ housing was needed however other priorities such as a new fire hall and medical services have been put aside. Pine Avenue is 18' wide and has no sidewalk and Mr. Ilchyna is concerned about the safety of children and pedestrians with the increase in traffic in the community. Another concern was adverse effects on the water and sewer system.

Also speaking in opposition was Mrs. Karen Klemchuk. She visited the applicant's development in Ste. Anne to see an actual example of what could be coming to the community. Her main concern was the possibility of a decrease in property values of surrounding properties. The increase of traffic could be a safety concern as many people walk to get their mail. She requested the developer possibly change Phase 2 to exit on Spruce Avenue to help disperse traffic more evenly. Another request is an 8' wooden fence around the entire development. Mrs. Klemchuk also presented a petition signed by twelve people in opposition to the application.

Mr. Joel Klemchuk spoke in opposition, also stating that not enough information was provided on the notification mailed to neighbouring properties.

Mr. Desmond Zacharias was in attendance to oppose the application, asking if more homework is needed, does a decision need to be made at this time.

Mr. John Fiebelkorn attended in opposition of the conditional use as his concern is with the increased strain on the water and sewer system, asking who would be responsible if incidents occurred such as sewage in basements of neighbouring properties. It was stated that the developer does have insurance in the event something does happen. Mr. Fiebelkorn asked if it was possible to split services down Pine and Spruce Avenues.

Discussion did take place regarding sidewalks and road standards in Tyndall.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Council of the Rural Municipality of Brokenhead approves this Conditional Use Application with the following conditions:

- 1. That the Developer enters into a development agreement with the RM of Brokenhead.
- 2. That the Developer is responsible for all issue of the water and wastewater infrastructure which would include providing an engineered plan of water and wastewater, a report on the required capacities to serve the development. Engineers report on any upgrades that would be required to service the development and bear all costs to do so.
- 3. That the Developer provides an engineered drainage plan to be approved by the Municipal Engineers.
- 4. That the Developer meets the parking requirements of Zoning By-law #1688, which may require visitors parking.

- 5. That the Developer provides 10% of the development for green space of the site and provide a landscaping plan to be approved by the RM or cash in lieu.
- 6. That the Development be fenced enclosed on the side yards and rear yard of the property, in compliance with Zoning By-law #1688.
- 7. That approval of this conditional use is restricted to the area zoned as "RA" Suburban Residential.
- 8. That the Developer pays capital development fees in the amount of \$4,500.00 per unit door.
- 9. That the Developer must start Phase 2 within 3 years to the day of this approval.
